

CSA NSW event: *Jocelyn Maughan* on *Colour* at the Bakehouse Gallery, 19 Bay St, Patonga, Sunday Dec 3 2023, 11:00 AM - 1:00 PM



The last event of the year for the CSA NSW Division will be a free in-person visit to the Bakehouse Gallery, Patonga, where eminent Australian artist and educator Jocelyn Maughan OAM will speak about and demonstrate her many insights into colour for painters. The visit will include a tour of both the public gallery and private storage areas to see the work of Jocelyn and fellow artist and educator Robin Norling OAM (1939 - 2017).

Jocelyn Maughan studied at the East Sydney Technical College (now the National Art School, Sydney) from 1954 to 1958, graduating with a Diploma of Fine Art with honours, specialising in painting. During this

period she studied colour under painters including James (Jimmy) Cook and under Head of Design, Phyllis Shillito. Her teaching career included 32 years at Meadowbank TAFE, where she established a Fine Arts section and became the inaugural Head of the Art School in 1966. Following her retirement from TAFE Jocelyn has continued to influence new generations of art students with the advice and feedback she freely provides to visitors to her gallery in Patonga, which she established with fellow artist and educator Robin Norling. Jocelyn's painting career spans more than six decades and she remains very active as an artist at age 84. She has had numerous solo exhibitions including major retrospectives at the Gosford Regional Gallery (2006, 2016) and the Manning Regional Art Gallery, Taree (2018). Her commissioned portraits hang in many public institutions, including the Reserve Bank of Australia and the Mitchell Library, Sydney. Her long list of prizes includes the Portia Geach Memorial Award (1975) and the Kedumba Drawing Award (2011), and she has been a finalist in the Archibald Prize on numerous occasions since 1965.
